

 Description **** [FOUR STARS] Take three parts clown, one part gibberish language, a dash of jarring pop music and shake until absurd. Pour over a captive audience and you have A World Elsewhere! Arias in the Key of Clown. I shit you not: This is an entire show of dancing clowns speaking entirely in gibberish. Only at the Fringe, kids. Only at the Fringe. And yet: Written and directed by Ben Newman and produced by Wide Eyed Productions, this wacky ensemble performance is strangely uplifting and—even more of a shock—thoroughly heartwarming. Though sophomoric in its depiction of NYC as a calamitous bully that grows to love—and be loved by—an insane clown posse, A World Elsewhere kept me engaged, amused and actually moved by its nonsensical singsong and dance.
